DISTINGUISHED ARTIST RECITAL

This season's Distinguished Artist Recital brings one of the most gifted pianists of our time to the Great Hall on February 8. Émile Naoumoff has been likened to both Vladimir Horowitz and Arthur Rubinstein. At the age of seven he became the last composition student of Nadia Boulanger, who referred to him as "The gift of my old age".



Yehudi Menuhin conducted the premiere of Emile's first Piano Concerto, with the composer as soloist, when he was ten years old. Émile regularly performs with the world's premier orchestras. His recital promises to be one of the finest music events yet presented at Cathedral Arts!

Cathedral Arts boasts a fine professional chorus, joining the wonderful organists Keith Franks and Artist-in-Residence Damin Spritzer for its frequent Evensong services, and the entire community is always welcome.
