

Important Dallas-area visual artists continue to bring spectacular and moving exhibits to Cathedral Arts. Sundermann Gallery has hosted three major exhibitions so far this season. September beginning in with Iuliana Crownover's intimate look at everyday life, Walking to School, followed by a dazzling collection for the Advent Season from Annie Ehrenreich entitled Sacred Space-Visual Voice. Richard Boul's wonderful photographic series, An Afghan Odyssey–1967 was installed in January and received the most visitors in the gallery's history. On Friday, April 12, an opening reception will be held for sixteen artists participating in the first Sundermann Gallery Invitational Multi-Media Exhibit, on view through mid-June!

## MUSIC IN THE CATHEDRAL

The Cathedral Arts Choral Artists are fine professional vocalists at St. Matthew's under the direction of Michie Akin and Monica Awbrey, who join cathedral organist Keith Franks for a season of Evensong services on the third Sunday of each month, with the exception of November and December. The glorious music, the ancient words and the beautiful surroundings invite everyone into quiet contemplation, away from the endless distractions of modern life. On Sunday, May 19, the season's final Evensong begins with a special organ recital by Dr. Damin Spritzer, Cathedral Arts Artist-in-Residence. The entire community is always welcome!



The 2019-2020 Distinguished Artist has just been selected. Sandra Mogensen, a prominent Danish pianist, recording artist and teacher, will explore gorgeous and seldom-heard music by

19th-century women composers. She'll be joined by Alessandra Comini, University Distinguished Professor of Art History Emerita at SMU, who will present works of women visual artists of the same period.
