



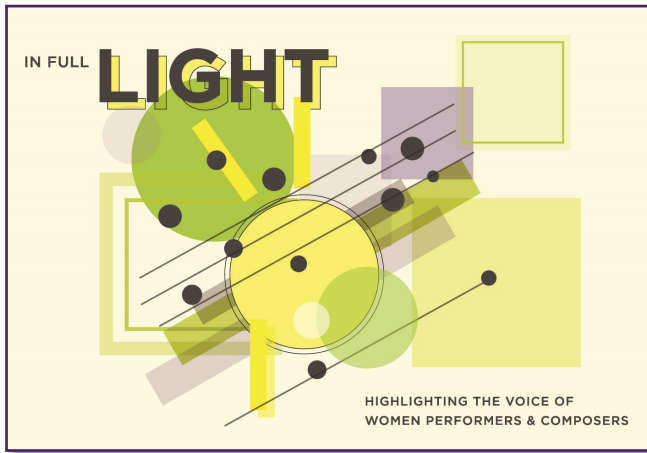
Fall 2019 Announcing the Eighth Season

Extraordinary musical offerings are in store for Cathedral Arts patrons this year! In a first for Cathedral Arts, the theme of "In Full Light: Highlighting the Voice of Women Performers and Composers" has been chosen to bring much-needed attention to the past and present contributions of women in music. Virtually all of the public concerts and worship services scheduled in the coming months will include seldom-heard works by extraordinary women composers, performed by internationally-acclaimed women artists. "The Supernatural Among Us." That's the intriguing title of Roger Shackelford's collection of composed images captured on a single frame of 120mm film. Join us on Sunday, September 15 at 5:00pm in the Justus Sundermann Gallery to welcome Roger and launch another moving season of exhibits by prominent Dallas-area visual artists.

Carolyn Brown returns to the Sundermann Gallery in November with "A Joyful Noise: Angel Musicians of Michoacán," a stunning collection of her photographs exploring the painted wooden ceilings of ancient churches in central Mexico. In January, Carlos Cázares brings "La Piñata Mexicana," his series of abstract paintings and graphics exploring the imagery and excitement of the beloved cultural icon.

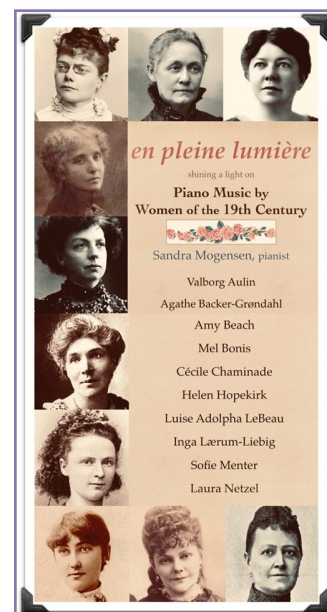


CHORAL EVENSONG

2020 DISTINGUISHED ARTIST

The annual Distinguished Artist Recital and Master Class is a unique opportunity to experience an intimate evening of superb music and personally engage with a major international performing and teaching pianist.
