Holiday greetings from St. Matthew's Cathedral Arts! Our first Winter newsletter celebrates ten years of superb performing and visual arts events with a new slate of offerings from outstanding artists. Following months of postponements and restrictions for the safety of artists and audiences, January 2022 begins our busiest Winter/Spring calendar to date! Cathedral Arts patrons are receiving news regarding an internationally-renowned American operatic bass-baritone, celebrated concert and recital pianists, extraordinary young vocal artists, new voices from South Africa, a CD launch concert, brilliant new Justus Sundermann Gallery exhibits, plus monthly Choral Evensong services with Monica Awbrey and the Cathedral Arts Choral Artists. December brings a special three-part series of talks on Handel's immortal Messiah, presented live online via Zoom by the gifted young tenor Jordan Hammons. 2022 will include a special series, Black Voices, focusing on contributions to the arts by Black American composers, performers and visual artists. In January, Dallas visual artists laShonda Cooks and her father Gary Cooks bring a collection of their current works to the Sundermann Gallery for a new exhibit entitled Sanctuary. Other presenters include the celebrated pianist Gregory Thompson, and gifted young singers from South Africa under the tutelage of SMU's Barbara Hill Moore. The 2022 Distinguished Artist is Donnie Ray Albert, a renowned Grammy Award-winning bass-baritone and regular guest of opera companies and symphony orchestras around the world. Honoring Black History Month, his February recital and master class, with the brilliant accompanist Rick Rowley, promise one of Cathedral Arts' most important musical offerings. March brings the Second Invitational Art Exhibit and the long-awaited recital of pianist Dongni Xie, in a program ranging from Domenico Scarlatti to jazz great Art Tatum. In May, pianist Mary Dibbern, soprano Courtney Maina and tenor Christopher A. Leach celebrate a new installment of Women's Voices with

MEET DONNIE RAY ALBERT, 2022 DISTINGUISHED ARTIST

This February we proudly welcome Donnie Ray Albert, an American operatic bass-baritone with an international career since 1976. Born in Louisiana, Albert earned a Bachelor of Music degree from L.S.U. in 1972, then completed a Master of Music degree from S.M.U., where he studied with Thomas Hayward. He made his professional debut in May 1975 at the Houston Grand Opera in Joplin's *Treemonisha*. In 1976 he returned to sing the role of Jake Wallace in Puccini's *La fanciulla del West* and portray Porgy to the Bess of Clamma Dale in a highly lauded production of Gershwin's *Porgy and Bess*. The production was transported to Broadway, where it ran for a total of 122 performances from September 1976 to January 1977. The production's recording won a Grammy Award for Best Opera Recording. In 1978 he debuted at the New York City Opera and the Washington National Opera, and in 1979 gave his first performance at the Lyric Opera of Chicago. During the 1980s Albert was highly active with regional opera companies in the U.S., appearing in Baltimore, Cincinnati, Dallas, Fort Worth, New Orleans, Portland and Tulsa, among others. From 1981-1983 he appeared at the Vancouver Opera and debuted at the Opera Company of Boston and the Palacio de Bellas Artes in Mexico City. In 1984 he debuted at the San Francisco Opera

and sang Porgy at the Teatro Comunale in Florence. During the late 1980s he performed with the Canadian Opera Company, the Michigan Opera Theatre and Florentine Opera. In 1988 he embarked on a major tour of *Porgy and Bess* in Europe. In 1996 Albert sang the title role in Wagner's *The Flying Dutchman* at Cologne Opera. At Milan's La Scala, he sang the roles of Hidraot in Gluck's *Armide* and the title role in Verdi's *Nabucco*. His other roles include Varlaam in *Boris Godunov*, Basilio in Rossini's *The Barber of Seville*, Count Monterone in Verdi's *Rigoletto*, Don Carlo in Verdi's *Ernani*, Don Fernando in Beethoven's *Fidelio*, Escamillo in Bizet's *Carmen*, Ferrando in Verdi's *It trovatore*, lago in Verdi's *Otello*, Jack Rance in Puccini's *La fanciulla del West*, Jochanaan in Strauss' *Salome*, Nourabad in Bizet's *Les pêcheurs de perles*, Timur in Puccini's *Turandot*, Valentin in Gounod's *Faust*, Trinity Moses in Weill's *Rise and Fall of the City of Mahagonny* and the title role in Gruenberg's *The Emperor Jones*. In 2020 he sang the role of Alberich in Wagner's *Götterdämmerung*, livestreamed for the Lyric Opera of Chicago. Albert has had an active career as a concert soloist, appearing with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Minnesota Orchestra, St. Paul Chamber Orchestra and the New York Philharmonic, among others. In April and May he returns to Houston Grand Opera as Lord Capulet in Gounod's *Roméo et Juliette*. Mr. Albert is currently Senior Lecturer in Voice at the Butler School of Music at the University of Texas in Austin. Make plans now to attend the 2022 Distinguished Artist Weekend, February 18 and 19 in the Great Hall.
